









- ♦ Various municipal governments are all over the map on dates and restrictions in place. We are hopeful that in most jurisdictions that they will fall in line with provincial government relaunch strategies.
- ♦ Once we have a relaunch strategy, likely by the end of May, we will communicate this to municipal governments and ask for their endorsements if possible For a mid-June to early July start.

## Desired Program Action Plans

- Regular Season play is priority
- ♦ Small Tournaments to be looked at once enough regular seasons programs are operating.
- ♦ Summer Baseball program is currently on hold but are looking at some form
- ♦ Plan to still hold the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Skins Tournament in Lethbridge on the Labor Day weekend.
- ♦ Looking at Divisional Championships as late as September this year.
- Investigating Safety Measures & Protocols as well as adjusting rules if necessary
- ♦ Continued and better communication
- Promote scheduling adjustments if cleared to play that would see Little League go into September if feasible.

## Regular Season play

- ♦ The cornerstone of the Little League program is the regular season. It allows local play and activity for the youth of that community without a lot of travel. At this time in our history, with travel restrictions and other challenges facing people, Little League's cornerstone becomes even more important this year.
- \* Each League is being encouraged with work with other nearby leagues and their District organizations to plan to conduct a regular season for players in their boundaries once a clearance has been given by provinical and local governments and health authorities.
- ♦ Combined league and teams will be available to use of course. In addition, leagues may be able to include players who may be in nearby areas who have chosen not to operate baseball in 2020 for their area.






- ♦ The current format of Summer Baseball is on hold for the 2020 season.
- ♦ A revised format that aims to allow some weekend events in late July or August is currenting in the planning stages.
- ♦ The concept of running regular season on weekdays and summer baseball on weekends is also a consideration at this time.
- The decision on what form and championship structure will exist in 2020 will likely not be decided until late May/early June.



- ♦ Alberta District #1 and Lethbridge have confirmed their desire to still operate the 2nd Annual Skins Tournament on the Labor Day weekend in 2020.
- ♦ The event will be structured to be a fun, inspirational, and safe weekend of baseball in the unique format that Little League Alberta created in 2019.
- More information will be available once regular season and summer baseball plans start to come to fruition in the coming weeks.





♦ Much information will be coming out in the coming days and this information will be shared with all of our leagues.



- Little League Alberta is committed to communicate efficiently and frequently moving forward. Video meetings, messages, podcasts and more will be the new normal in communications so you are front row for everything happening in the Little League world.
- ♦ In addition to the updates on planning and preparation with the Little League Alberta President/CEO, we also are ramping up opportunities for coaches, umpires, and safety officers.
- \* The goal is to make this part of the program moving forward, not just during this pandemic.



- ♦ This is an unprecedented time. Flexibility and positivity are critical to restarting programs and having them be successful.
- ♦ We are encouraging Leagues to operate when permitted to do so and also to consider scheduling a different time period for regular season play (ie – June to August, July to September, August to September).
- Summer ball may be an August and September program in 2020.
- ♦ The old adege of "nothing is off the table" as you plan for the resumption of play is definitely appropriate.

## League Priorities

- ♦ Here are some of the recommendations that Little League has for our Leagues to perform during this delay on the actual season:
  - ♦ Regular communication with Members using modern technology
  - Share Little League International, Little League Canada, Little League Alberta/Saskatchewan messages
    - ♦ Engage the players & parents as much as possible
    - ♦ Ensure you are looking to prepare to update your Safety Policy/Plan
    - Check your insurance coverage to ensure mo lapse in coverage
  - Fill out the survey coming out in May to offer ideas on a positive future for the game in the Prairie provinces.



- ♦ Connect with your volunteers and get them to assist in preparation for the start of the baseball season in this new environment. Building buyin from the volunteers so their voices are heard is important.
- ♦ Share as much information (news, podcasts, etc) with your membership.
- ♦ Little League Alberta has launched its podcasts for coaching and umpiring and will be doing so throughout May and June.
